Minutes of Monthly Meeting, May 15, 2017 Bastrop City Hall, 1311 Chestnut Street, Bastrop, Texas

The Bastrop Economic Development Corporation (BEDC) met on Monday, May 15, 2017, at 6:00 p.m. at Bastrop City Hall, 1311 Chestnut Street, for the Regular Monthly Meeting.

Board members present were: Kristi Koch, Kevin Plunkett, Drusilla Rogers, Joe Beal and Cam Chavez. Board member Mayor Ken Kesselus was absent. Staff members present: Shawn Kirkpatrick, Angela Ryan, Jean Riemenschneider, and Kathy Merrifield. BEDC Attorney Habib Erkan was also present.

- 1. CALL TO ORDER Board Vice-Chair Kristi Koch called the Board Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.
- 2. **PUBLIC COMMENT(S)** Main Street Director Sarah O'Brien introduced the Downtowntx.com website and gave a quick demonstration regarding how the site works.

3. REGULAR BUSINESS & PRESENTATIONS

- 3.1. Approval of meeting minutes of the Special Board Meeting of April 24, 2017. Mr. Beal made the motion to approve the minutes as submitted, Mr. Plunkett seconded and the motion passed.
- 3.2. Acceptance of the Bastrop EDC's financial summary report for period ending April 30, 2017. Mr. Kirkpatrick reviewed the financials. Mr. Plunkett made the motion to accept the financials as submitted, Mr. Chavez seconded and the motion passed.
- 3.3. Consideration, discussion and possible action on approving a Business Incentive Grant Agreement for the building located at 1008 Main Street, owned by Baham Interests, LP, in the amount of \$10,000. Mr. Beal made the motion to approve a BEDC Business Incentive Grant Agreement (BIG #2017-005) for the building located at 1008 Main Street, owned by Baham Interests, LP, for FY2017, and authorize the Executive Director to execute the agreement on behalf of the EDC. Mr. Chavez seconded and the motion passed.
- 3.4. Presentation and discussion on the Loop 150 Downtown Trail Expansion. Mr. Kirkpatrick reported on the public input session held May 10, 2017. Many citizens attended and the feedback was positive. Tracy Bratton of Bowman Consulting updated the Board on the scope of the project and costs associated with each phase over a three-year period. Mr. Beal asked about the economic benefit of the project, and Mr. Kirkpatrick stated the 1.8 mile finished loop will solve many issues, connecting east and west of the Colorado River, north and south of Highway 71, and addressing public safety concerns. The consensus of the Board was for the project to move forward. A resolution will be drafted for a future meeting.
- 3.5. Presentation and discussion regarding planning, engineering and site improvements for the Bastrop Business and Industrial Park. Mr. Kirkpatrick briefed the Board on the scope of the project. Mr. Bratton explained the project would create a second ingress/egress to the Business Park to comply with the City of Bastrop's development ordinance. He said lot A1 would be a more efficient location for the detention pond than lot B1. Mr. Kirkpatrick explained the infrastructure should have been completed upon acquisition of the Park and would make it more marketable. Once the infrastructure is completed and approved by the city, it will become an asset of the city to maintain long-term.

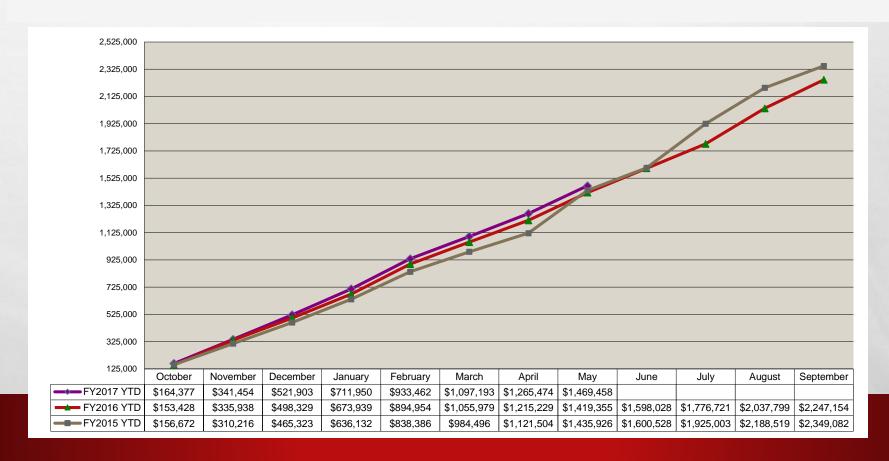

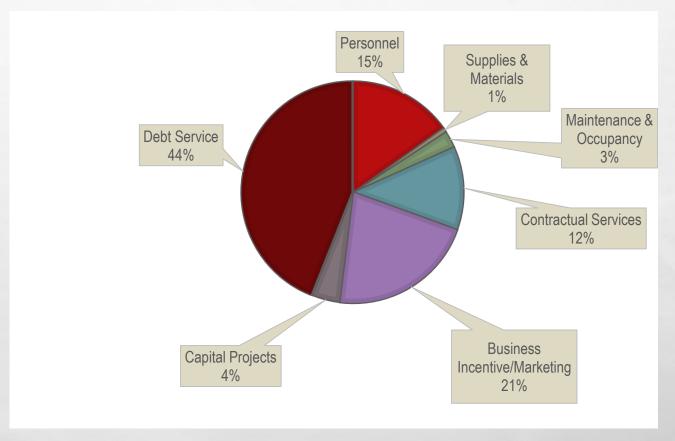
Summary of Revenues AS OF MAY 31, 2017

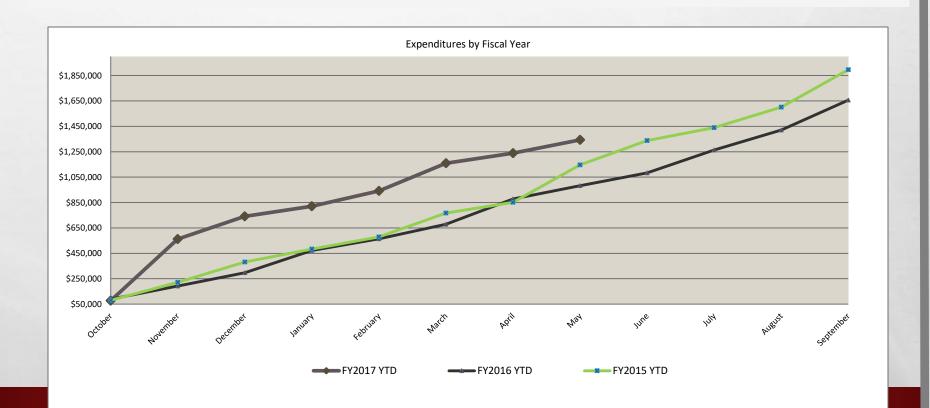

Bastrop EDC Receives 2017 Workforce Excellence Award from Texas Economic Development Council, Nation's Largest State Economic Development Association

Recognition for Bastrop Youth Career Day honors innovative, community-supported model initiative

Bastrop, Texas, June 8, 2017 – The Texas Economic Development Council today presented its 2017 Workforce Excellence Award (Population up to 15,000) to the Bastrop Economic Development Corporation. The presentation recognizing the 2016 Bastrop Youth Career Day program was made at a special awards breakfast held during the TEDC's mid-year conference in Plano, Texas. The Workforce Excellence Award Program recognizes exceptional contributions by a Texas community or region in the area of workforce development. Nominated programs were judged on innovativeness, community commitment and leverage, measured objectives, transferability, and secondary benefits.

"Our team is truly honored to receive this statewide recognition for our work in linking education and workforce development, because bringing meaningful employment to our citizens requires a diverse, educated workforce," said Executive Director Shawn Kirkpatrick. "These students are our future citizens, employers and leaders, so it's vital to support their successful transition to the workplace."

The now-annual event was hosted and sponsored by the Bastrop EDC, Workforce Solutions Rural Capital Area, the City of Bastrop, the Bastrop Chamber of Commerce and Bastrop ISD. The EDC served as the central coordinating body and as the conduit to employers and area leaders who want to help students achieve their goals after they graduate. Workforce Solutions provided grant funding as well as onsite job coaching to students. Bastrop Youth Career Day is already viewed as the gold standard in the region, and other communities in the county have sought out the Bastrop EDC's guidance on hosting their own career day events.

Clear pathways to rewarding employment

The Bastrop EDC has taken a lead role in bridging the gaps between school and sustainable employment via workforce development. Toward this end, Bastrop Youth Career Day has become one of its key community initiatives to advance high school graduates' workforce readiness while enhancing economic development. It has four primary objectives:

- 1. Allow students to see real-world applications of what they are learning in school and the career opportunities available in Bastrop regardless of their plans post-graduation.
- 2. Help satisfy Texas' legislated (HB-5) educational mandates and community needs for workforce-ready graduates by connecting students and industry.
- 3. Support students' progress along state-prescribed career pathways based on their aptitudes and interests
- 4. Enable employers to identify and recruit work- and trade-ready employees from within the community.

Bastrop Youth Career Day overview

The award-winning Bastrop Youth Career Day event was held on Wednesday, May 18, 2016 from 9 a.m. till noon at the Bastrop ISD's Performing Arts Center. The multifaceted event for the school district's juniors and seniors kicked off with an inspiring keynote, followed by an engaging "do's and don'ts" video and an informative business panel. The latter half of the program was a career fair featuring exhibitors and displays. These included nearly 50 businesses, public service and governmental agencies, nonprofits and armed forces recruiters. In addition, post-secondary educational institutions presented opportunities for graduating students to pursue further studies or vocational/skills training in order to enter specific fields. Some participating employers took applications for current or summer job openings, while others scouted future employees or introduced students to their organizations and offerings. This gave students a unique glimpse into their potential futures post-graduation and enabled one-to-one exchanges with businesses and organizations otherwise unavailable to them.

Through these interactions aligned with HB-5 career pathways, students were exposed to myriad possibilities and explored the difference between a job and a career. Outside in the parking lot, first responders, military recruiters and companies with heavy equipment showcased their "tools of the trade." These included a PHI Air Medical helicopter, a Navy dune buggy, and an Austin Police Bomb Squad K-9 team and bomb-disposal robot. Recruiters from the armed forces discussed their pathways to training in specific jobs, as well as opportunities to earn money for college, both of which support workforce development.

Student-focused program with communitywide benefits

By hosting Bastrop Youth Career Day with its community partners, the EDC helps ensure that students graduate prepared for college or with high-demand skills that equip them to land rewarding, well-paid jobs, ideally within Bastrop. It also helps the business community learn more about area students preparing to enter the workforce. Data compiled from student registrations gives employers an early glimpse of students' career intentions and a baseline for future reference.

Kirkpatrick and Jean Riemenschneider, who leads the EDC's Education and Workforce program, accepted the award on behalf of the Bastrop Economic Development Corporation. Also in attendance were Workforce Solutions Rural Capital Area Manager Ben Williams and Bastrop ISD Director of Student Advancement Jennifer Edenfield, representing the community partners.

"The opportunity to work with our community and to tap the unlimited potential of our students has been an absolute pleasure," said Riemenschneider. "It has been extremely rewarding to see the students get excited and express interest in companies they didn't know were right here in their own backyard."

"Partnerships are vital to the success of a community and Bastrop Youth Career Day demonstrates their impact in giving students invaluable exposure to opportunities after high school," said Bastrop Chamber of Commerce President Becki Womble. "Together, we are developing our students – our future workforce – which builds a stronger business climate and ultimately creates a successful community. We are all part of this dynamic ecosystem."

THIS IS AN AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the Bastrop Economic Development Corporation, an Economic Development Corporation created by and through the laws of the State of Texas, hereinafter called "BEDC", acting by and through its duly authorized representative, and The Charek Corporation, hereinafter called "GRANTEE," acting by and through its duly authorized representative.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, commercial property owners desire to generate adequate rents and revenues from their commercial buildings while creating a sense of pride in their investment; and

WHEREAS, the BEDC through the Bastrop Incentive Grant ("BIG") Program wishes to maintain and improve the quality of life for its citizens, attract outside spending, generate additional jobs, and increase sales tax by fostering economically viable commercial districts; and

WHEREAS, the objective of the BIG Program is to provide assistance to those who are attempting to improve the appearance of commercial properties along commercial corridors and those who wish to preserve, save, and improve historic properties in Bastrop; and

WHEREAS, the BEDC has created and approved a process whereby buildings located within the City of Bastrop may apply for a BIG Program grant from the BEDC.

II.

NOWTHEREFORE, upon an affirmative vote of the majority of the BEDC Board, on _______, the BEDC determined that GRANTEE qualified for a reimbursement grant (the "Reimbursement") in the amount of \$7,100.00 for the improvements as provided for in its application, and that said Reimbursement shall be distributed to GRANTEE under the following terms and conditions:

- (a) For and in consideration of the Reimbursement to GRANTEE by the BEDC, the funds distributed are intended to reimburse GRANTEE for the eligible expenses associated with improvements to the building at 916 Main Street (the "Project"). All reimbursements shall be for the Project and its associated eligible costs as submitted by the GRANTEE and approved by the Main Street Design Committee and the BEDC.
- (b) The Reimbursement shall be contingent on compliance with the Project, this Agreement, the ordinances of the City of Bastrop, the laws of the State of Texas, and the Bastrop Business Incentive Grant (BIG) Program Guidelines, Application, Criteria & Checklist (the "Guidelines") as attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein as if fully set forth herein.
- (c) Upon completion of the Project, GRANTEE shall submit a final financial accounting to the BEDC (the "Report") showing a line item accounting of all eligible costs expended during the Project, which shall be accompanied by the check register of all related expenditures. Invoices, receipts or other proofs of expenditures shall be presented with the Report. The BEDC shall be the sole and final decision maker as to the sufficiency of the Report and associated invoices, receipts or other proofs of expenditures and may deny all or partial reimbursement for lack of sufficiency.

(d) The Project shall be completed and the Report submitted by September 30,

2017.

(e) Upon submission of the Report and associated invoices, receipts and other

proofs of expenditures, the BEDC shall verify compliance with this Agreement and

distribute the reimbursement.

III.

GRANTEE agrees not to change or alter the final Project without prior written approval

from the Main Street Program office for five (5) years from the date of the GRANTEE signing this

Agreement (the "Grant Period"). The property must remain in commercial use during the Grant

Period. If a change in use occurs and the property is not used for commercial purposes for longer

than any 180 day period, then GRANTEE shall be required to reimburse 100% of the Funds back

to the BEDC.

GRANTEE shall maintain ownership of the property for five (5) years immediately

following the submission of the Report. If this requirement is not met the GRANTEE shall

reimburse BEDC the Funds as provided:

Property sold within 2 years = reimburse 100%

Property sold within 3 years = reimburse 75%

Property sold within 4 years = reimburse 50%

Property sold within 5 years = reimburse 25%

IV.

It is understood and agreed that in the event any provision of this Agreement is inconsistent

with requirements of law, the requirements of law will control and the parties shall revert to their

respective positions which would otherwise be enjoyed or occupied by the respective parties for

In 2002, the Bastrop EDC purchased property near the Mayfest Hill Rodeo Arena from Barbara Humble. In January 2015, the EDC Board voted to transfer the property to the City of Bastrop. However, there was no resolution or other documentation done at that time.

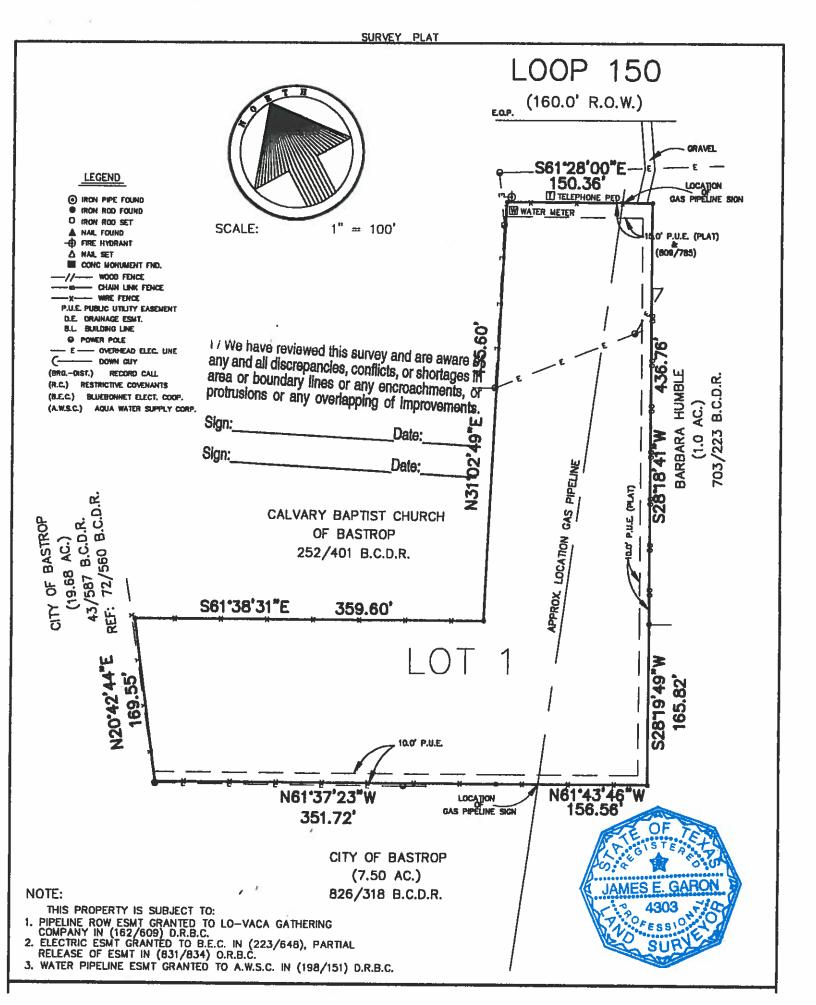

Bastrop County is in the process of purchasing the building located at 1501 Business Park Drive in the Bastrop Business and Industrial Park (the former Bargas building) to house three County services: Office of Emergency Management, Information Technology, and 9-1-1 Communications and Dispatch. This will require the erection of a 175-foot communications tower. The City of Bastrop's code stipulates a structure height limit of 35 feet.

Bastrop County has filed a request for a Conditional Use Permit (CUP) with the City of Bastrop's Planning Department, which will be discussed at a Planning & Zoning meeting within the next few weeks.

Staff is requesting the EDC Board approve a letter of support for the CUP.

(1) Coffee Chat

The City of Bastrop Main Street Program and the Bastrop Economic Development Corporation held a Coffee Chat on Friday, June 16th, at the Bastrop EDC Offices. The quarterly Coffee Chat is an opportunity for the public to sit and chat with the EDC and Main Street staff and share their thoughts and ideas. This was the second one of 2017.



(2) FiberLight Project

The EDC held a groundbreaking with FiberLight to commence construction of the dark fiber backbone being installed in the Business Park. Work began on May 18th and will be complete as soon as they receive a permit from TxDOT, which should be within the next couple of weeks. AEI Technologies will be the first tenant in the Business Park to have access to 1G fiber.



(3) Downtown Trail Expansion

Bowman Consulting is working on developing a scope of work to engineer the sidewalk project. A public hearing is scheduled for the July 17th Board meeting, along with a resolution approving the project.

(4) Retail and Restaurant Customer Service Training

The EDC has partnered with the Main Street Program to offer Customer Service Excellence training to community businesses. The training is scheduled for Monday, July 10th, at the Bastrop Convention Center and will be offered in two sessions. The morning session is specifically tailored toward restaurant employees, and the afternoon session will cover retail. Registration is at www.bastropdowntown.com/customer-service-training.





(5) TEDC Economic Excellence Award

For the third year in a row, the Bastrop EDC has received an Economic Excellence Recognition Award from the Texas Economic Development Council (TEDC). The Economic Excellence Recognition program provides recognition to economic development organizations that meet a desired threshold of professionalism. Recipients qualify for recognition based on training taken by their governing board/council as well as the economic development director and professional staff. Certifications, professional memberships and activities, and organizational effectiveness of the economic development staff also contribute to the standards for qualification.

(6) 921 Main Street
